#### Briefing IGTC online poll Adoption of electronic documentation in the grain trade

In July 2016 the IGTC's Working Group agreed to extend its work plan into 2017, with a strong focus on communication activities and the exploration of new tools to convey the evolution of industry innovation and uptake of electronic trade documentation.

One such tool was the launch on 11<sup>th</sup> August of an anonymous, confidential online poll to garner data on the uptake of such electronic trade documentation. At the very least, the results of the poll are intended to give a snapshot of how the technology is currently perceived among the IGTC's global participants.

All IGTC members received the survey and were invited to share it with relevant companies in their networks. Participants were asked to complete just one survey per company, and consider only import and export transactions. It was highlighted that all responses will be treated with the utmost confidentiality and only seen by the IGTC Secretariat.

Thanks to IGTC industry volunteers, the poll has been translated into Spanish and Portuguese. There may be appetite to translate it into other languages in the coming weeks.

## KEY FINDINGS

**Over half – 67%** of respondents confirm they are currently using electronic trade documentation;

- Adoption began no more than three years ago, and has continued well into 2016, with the most recent adoption reported three months ago;
- > **No respondents** currently use electronic documents for all transactions.
- Half of respondents stated they aim for at least 50% of their transactions to move to electronic documentation by 2018.
- Over half 67% of respondents stated they plan for the wholescale adoption by 2025 i.e. a rate of 75-100% of electronic trade documentation for all documents in one transaction.

- <u>67%</u> responded YES
